Who is eligible? Anyone with an interest in Drama and the world of the theatre. **A GCSE in Drama is not essential.** However, energy, enthusiasm and a willingness to engage fully with all aspects of the course (including acting in lessons if not for assessment) are vital prerequisites, as is a commitment to attending a wide range of live theatre productions, both with the department and through individual initiative. Completing all written assignments to a high standard is crucial to success.

A LEVEL QUALIFICATION

The A level qualification comprises of THREE components:

Drama and Theatre:	Knowledge and understanding of drama and theatre. The study of TWO set texts.
Creating Original Drama:	Analysis and evaluation of the work of live theatre makers. How is it assessed? Written exam - 3 hours Open Book 80 marks 40% of the A Level
Making Theatre - Practical	Practical What is being assessed? The Process of Creating Devised Drama; Performance of Devised Drama - Influenced by the work and methodologies of one prescribed practitioner. How is it assessed? Working Notebook (40 Marks) Devised Performance (20 Marks) 30% of the A Level What is being assessed? Practical exploration and interpretation of THREE extracts each taken from a different play. Extract THREE is to be performed as a final assessed piece. Reflective Report analysing and evaluating theatrical interpretation of all THREE extracts How is it assessed? Performance of Extract Three - (40 marks) Reflective Report - (20 marks) 30% of the A Level

AS LEVEL EXAMINATION

The AS course has TWO components:

1. Interpreting Drama

What is being assessed?

The study of a Set Play and Live Theatre Production – analysis and evaluation of a live theatre production

How is it assessed?

A written examination testing student's knowledge of the two areas of study
This exam represents 40% of the AS qualification.

2. Process and Performance

How is it assessed?

The performance of TWO chosen extracts from two different plays – extract TWO is practically assessed and both are written about in a Portfolio which is divided into three sections:

Research
Performance Development
Analysis and evaluation

This component represents 60% of the AS qualification.
