<p>Why choose the subject?</p>	<p>Sociology attracts students who are interested in current affairs and issues and in the society in which we all live. As with other Social Science A levels, this links in very well with other subjects because the topics covered in the course are very cross-curricular.</p> <p>Sociology can be of direct relevance and benefit to a whole host of careers, including Journalism, Nursing, Social Work, Local Government, Teaching, Advertising or Business.</p>
<p>Who is eligible?</p>	<p>The syllabus assumes no previous study of Sociology at GCSE. It must be stressed that Sociology is not an “easy option”. It is rigorous, and demands a dedicated and hard-working approach to the course if you are going to succeed.</p> <p>As well as producing written assignments, you will be expected to read regularly and make relevant notes, take part in class discussions, watch DVDs and prepare and present some aspect of a topic in class.</p> <p>It is important to keep abreast of current affairs by reading one of the quality newspapers, listening to/watching the news regularly and watching relevant documentaries on television/online where appropriate.</p>
