Children and young people across the country have experienced unprecedented disruption to their education as a result of coronavirus (COVID-19). Normal schooling stopped in March 2020 and all pupils returned in September 2020. During this time engagement in learning, academic and personal development by all pupils across the country varied, and in recognition of the support pupils may need to catch up funding is provided by the Government.

This statement details how these funds these funds are being used.

Identified Needs

The needs of our pupils has been identified based on assessment of our pupils when they returned to school in September 2020. Our Pupil Premium programme provided evidence of needs for those who benefit from additional support.

Our findings of need has shown the greatest need across the school community to be re-engaging with their peers, returning to a more structured programme of learning and re-establishing their confidence with the current world.

Our **Programme Plan** has therefore focused on individual support when needed. The allocation of 4 support staff trained to provide both pastoral and learning support has enabled pupils to either have a structure programme of time, or, to be on hand as and when needed. Specialised pastoral staff engage with those that need a listening ear and coaching to take their next steps.

Pupils can access support via the HOH hub, by referral or by attending a quiet learning centre.

This programme for the Coronavirus (COVID-19) catch-up premium are in addition to our Pupil Premium programme.
