PUPIL PREMIUM – STATUTORY INFORMATION

Pupil premium is additional funding provided by the Department for Education to enhance the education of vulnerable groups of children

The amount of Pupil Premium allocated to Bournemouth School for Girls during the financial year 2015-16 was £45,600. The amount estimated to be received in 2016-17 is £49,950.

The Pupil Premium has been spent in an integrated way to ensure that entitled students receive the opportunity for additional support, use of facilities and additional learning opportunities. Examples of this across all key stages are the additional staffing allocated for learning support (FSM, LAC and other vulnerable pupils) which provides specific support for individual students. Funding will be used to provide additional tuition, generate additional help, materials and resources and staff to support academic enhancement activities and extra-curricular activities.

In addition, the Pupil Premium allocation was used to provide targeted intervention for students in need of additional help in Mathematics and English. It was also used to provide programmes of support, improve pupil attainment, trips and activities and special projects. These activities and resources will continue to be funded year on year.

The impact in educational attainment arising from expenditure of the previous financial year's Pupil Premium has been demonstrable with improvement in academic progress, personal and social development and attendance. In 2016, 100% of pupils in receipt of Pupil Premium gained 5 or more GCSEs at Grade A* - C including English and Maths. Their progress score was 0.34, above the whole school figure of 0.3.

The school's support for disadvantaged pupils was marked with a letter of congratulations in January 2014 and January 2015 from the Minister of State for Education stating that we were amongst the top secondary schools nationally in terms of the progress made by our Pupil Premium pupils.
